Events within Worlingworth or the immediate surrounding villages may be permitted, depending on space, but forcing the boards open or sticking notices on the outside of the boards will not be tolerated and will only result in costs to the community should further replacements be needed. Please respect the locks.

#### Community Speedwatch - We've Got Six Volunteers - But We Want More!

The Parish Council is pleased to confirm that we will be going ahead with setting up a Community Speedwatch Group, as we have the minimum number of volunteers, but bearing in mind the old adage that many hands make light work, we are still keen to hear from anyone else who would like to be involved.

- \* All volunteers need to be over 18 years of age.
- \* Volunteers will be expected to sign a Community Speedwatch Agreement and go through a vetting process.
- \* All equipment will be provided by Suffolk Constabulary, training will be provided on using the equipment and on H&S issues.
- \* Volunteers will be covered by Suffolk Constabulary insurance whilst carrying out Speedwatch duties.
- \* Locations chosen will be assessed by Suffolk Constabulary.

#### Would You Like To Adopt A Roadside Planter?

Following positive feedback from the first batch of planters that were placed in the village at the beginning of 2024, a further seven have been purchased and will be planted up soon. These planters are there for a number of reasons: 1) they are part of the traffic calming scheme - research has shown that cultivated planters help to slow down traffic as they demonstrate the driver is passing through a residential area, 2) they are positioned to help prevent parking on the Village Green, to avoid the grass being churned up, 3) they are part of our ongoing commitment to increase biodiversity in the village as part of the WorlyGiG scheme (Worlingworth Getting It Green).

If you would like to be involved with the WorlyGiG scheme and would like to 'adopta-planter' as either an individual, or as part of your local club or group, then please get in touch with the Parish Clerk.

If you expressed an interest in adopting a planter the first time round (before we realised that the initial planting came with 12 months maintenance) we will be in touch to see if it is still something that you would like to be involved with.
